





COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- 46 Student Consulting Lab Projects
- 13 students join nonprofit boards through Boards Fellows program
- Formed Community of Ambassadors to inform Evans engagement work
- Launched Theory to Practice alumni events (213 attended + viewed)
- Held two Dean's Forums on Race & Public Policy (922 participated + viewed)
- Initial offering of Public Matters to highlight community leaders (392 participated + viewed)

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

- 34%** of students receive fellowships, totaling \$800k+ annually
- 529** households gave more than \$1.5 million to the Evans School in 2021
