Post-Doctoral Alliance Fellow Application

Last January, the Evans School became one of six Founding Members of the new **Public Affairs Diversity Alliance**, an effort to unite the top public affairs and policy schools across the country that share a commitment to encouraging, training, mentoring, and promoting **diverse scholars** of public affairs and policy. Led for the first two years by American University, additional founding member schools include the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University; the Ford School of Public Policy at the University of Michigan; Sanford School of Public Policy at Duke University; and Price School at the University of Southern California.

The Alliance, the first of its kind in public affairs, seeks to encourage and sustain a pipeline of candidates for faculty positions in criminal justice, policy, and public administration.

As part of our commitment to the Alliance, the Evans School is proud to identify and name a Post-Doctoral Fellow as our Alliance Fellow. Serving as the Alliance Fellow is a one-year term appointment, with the possibility of one renewal for a maximum of two academic years.

This fellowship will include:

- An internal faculty mentor
- An external faculty mentor
- Travel funding to the April 2020 meeting of Alliance Fellows at American University, as well as to additional fall 2020 conferences as appropriate/applicable.
